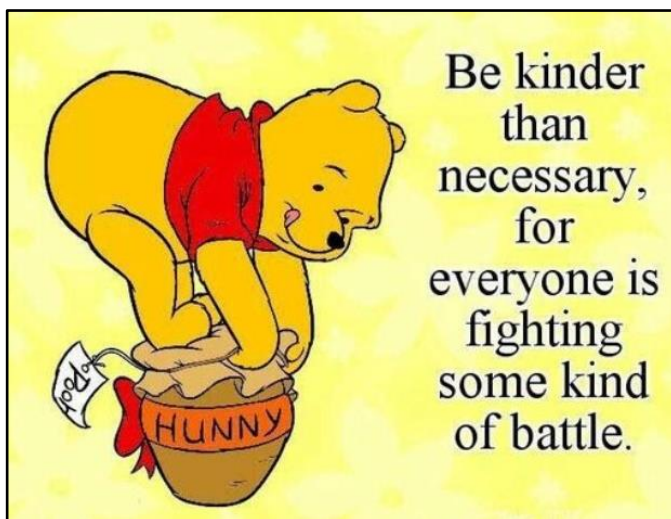
CIRCUIT DIRECTORY
