The church Council met on Tuesday 7th February and we carefully considered our response to the decision made at Methodist Conference concerning the Report, "God in love Unites Us." Conference asked all churches and ministers to make a decision as to whether or not they wish to be registered for same sex weddings. We recognise that this an emotive subject and that there are strongly and sincerely held views on both sides of the debate. In love and prayer, the Church Council heard opinions of members and voted with an overwhelming majority that Barrow Upon Soar Methodist Church would seek to be registered for same sex marriages. There were no votes against and some neutral votes. We appreciate that this might not have been your decision and would like to say that we spoke about the gift of love being for all people, all people being made in God's image and being welcoming and inclusive. We also recognised that we have few weddings and would not expect a stampede as a result of our decision.

If you feel you would like to talk to me about this decision, I would welcome a conversation.


"Up here – we go by results," says Saint Peter. "When you preached – people slept. When he flew, people prayed."
